

2020: OVERCOMING UNPRECEDENTED CHALLENGES

A Letter from the Founder and Chairman of the Board

Dear Friends,

Practicing perseverance tops the list for 2020. It was a year of unprecedented challenges locally, nationally and globally. It was also a year of unwavering support from communities near and far.

I'm extremely proud of our passionate and committed team members for working through the pandemic with bravery, creativity and flexibility. They continued to go above and beyond to ensure the health and well-being of residents and staff, including delivering meals daily, creating safe and innovative engagement opportunities, and organizing virtual visits with loved ones. We communicated with family members frequently to share resident engagement, health updates and to relay continuously changing protocols.

One of our greatest challenges was managing significant unbudgeted expenses (including crucial supplies of food, protective gear, and sanitation supplies) with simultaneous decreases in revenue from on-site day program services and deferred move-ins.

Our ability to continue to serve and provide care to our beloved seniors today is thanks to our outstanding team members, residents, friends and donors who supported us emotionally, financially and physically through the unforgettable year.

Personally, and on behalf of the Board of Directors, **thank you** to every single team member and donor of time or treasure for making all we have accomplished possible. I look forward to keeping you informed as we expand to make an even greater impact on the lives of all seniors, not only those with Alzheimer's and related memory challenges, as Abe's Garden Community.

Here's a look back at some noteworthy moments at Abe's Garden in 2020:

JANUARY

"Mealtime Assistance and Nutrition for People with Dementia," a collaboration with Vanderbilt University Medical Center, launched "Snack Tips," the fifth video in the nutrition education video series

Sixteen seventh graders visited and interviewed residents for The Ensworth Memory Project, a multidisciplinary school project that launched its partnership with Abe's Garden in 2016



FEBRUARY

Live entertainment was in full swing, including an Elvis impersonator who charmed and entertained residents on Valentine's Day and Belmont University theatre students who sang Broadway songs

The Independent Living dining room celebrated its grand opening to reveal renovations

The Rapid Response team, including clinical and leadership staff, was developed to be informed daily about COVID-19 and proactively prepare



MARCH



COVID-19 restrictions began and protocols were implemented per the Tennessee Department of Health

Virtual visits for residents and loved ones were initiated

Delivery of meals and individual in-home engagement activities to Independent and Assisted Living residents began

APRIL

Virtual engagement activities – such as exercises, “Virtual Vacations” and concerts – were launched via online platforms

Staff communication training through the Paraprofessional Healthcare Institute (PHI) began for those in supervisory positions

The sixth and final chapter of the nutrition education video series, “Mealtime Observations,” premiered

MAY

Initiated a partnership with Thompson & Associates to offer complimentary estate planning to friends of Abe’s Garden, which reviews or creates a plan to minimize taxes and maximize what is left for loved ones and cherished organizations

In response to the pandemic, Giving Tuesday announced May 5th to be an additional day of global giving and unity, which helped Abe’s Garden raise nearly \$12K



Abe’s Garden Community Group participants virtually reunited once again with their inspirational British pal, Peter Berry, who was diagnosed with early onset dementia and has co-authored *Slow Puncture: Living Well With Dementia*

Residents were treated to Mother’s Day corsages handmade by Primrose students

JUNE

The entire staff was thanked publicly in *Community Impact Newspaper*

Donna Coleman, MS, CFRE, who served as Gift Planning Advisor, was promoted to Senior Director, Marketing and Development



JULY

PHI communication training was expanded to all staff

Kylie Stratton joined the team as Senior Director, Home Care to launch Abe’s Garden at Home

AUGUST


Abe’s Garden celebrated 5 years of transforming care for individuals with Alzheimer’s disease and other dementias with a special 5-year anniversary issue of *Seeds*

OCTOBER

Abe’s Garden received a Tennessee Community CARES Program grant to help with ongoing efforts to address health and economic needs created by the pandemic

SEPTEMBER

Alzheimer’s Disease International published *World Alzheimer Report 2020: Design, Dignity, Dementia*, in which Abe’s Garden is featured as a case study and recognized as a “groundbreaker” in design for people living with dementia



NOVEMBER

An anonymous \$250K gift was received to support the expansion of music and dance-focused initiatives throughout the campus

DECEMBER

Musicians On Call, a nonprofit organization that provides unique volunteer-driven music experiences, provided residents with virtual performances and a virtual meet-and-greet with artists Kelsea Ballerini and Morgan Evans

Instruments For Education donated three violins, which are being used by our life engagement team for community performances and to offer residents one-on-one lessons

MISSION STATEMENT





REVENUE/EXPENSES


(in millions)

(in thousands)







Alzheimer's and dementia deaths have **INCREASED 16%** during the COVID-19 pandemic



More than **6M AMERICANS** are living with Alzheimer's



1 IN 3 SENIORS dies with Alzheimer's or other dementia; it kills more people than breast cancer and prostate cancer combined.



Between 2000 and 2019, deaths from heart disease have decreased 7.3% while **DEATHS FROM ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE HAVE INCREASED 145%**
