The sense of community on our campus has been more evident in the last couple of years than ever before. Team members and residents became family when they were unable to safely see their own. Creativity was ignited to keep everyone entertained during a lockdown. And personal sacrifices were made to help keep the community as safe as possible.

Perseverance is possible with a supportive community. In 2021, we joined all of our services under one name, which amplifies the fact that *together*, *we are even better*.

Abe's Garden Memory Care and Park Manor Independent and Assisted Living are now *Abe's Garden Community*.

In separate spaces on one campus, we provide residential options for those choosing to live independently, those needing assisted living, and those with memory loss who require specialized care. Additionally, we offer non-residential services to benefit the larger Nashville community, including home care services (Abe's Garden at Home), adult day programming (Abe's Garden Club), and an engaging, supportive group for those in the earliest stages of dementia (Abe's Garden Community Group). And I'm proud to say we have successfully shared our best practice approaches with communities around the globe via our free caregiving videos.

Since its inception, the Abe's Garden mission has been focused on improving the lives of those touched by Alzheimer's disease and related memory challenges. This unity of brands allows us to implement our longterm vision to **enhance the lives and cognitive health of** *all* **seniors**, not just those living with memory loss.

As a unified organization, under one name, we share innovative programming, wellness initiatives, and philanthropic resources to achieve our common mission of serving older adults and their caregivers, whether on or off our campus.

Here's a look back at some noteworthy moments at Abe's Garden Community in 2021:



JANUARY

- 184 residents and employees received their initial dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine during our first on-site Walgreensadministered vaccine clinic.
- Abe's Garden was highlighted in the "Making a Difference" feature of Belle Meade Living magazine's January issue.
- Indoor in-person visitations resumed throughout campus.



FEBRUARY

- We hosted our second on-site Walgreens-administered COVID-19 Moderna vaccine clinic for residents and employees to receive their first or second dose.
- Over 30 team members stayed on campus for days during the winter ice storm to ensure residents' needs were met.

MARCH

• In-person activities resumed for independent and assisted living residents with social distancing and mask requirements.

MAY

• Abe's Garden Memory Care and Park Manor Independent and Assisted Living united under one brand: Abe's Garden Community.



• Judy Shmerling Given, LPCP, Senior Director, Campus Development, was honored with the Vision of Hope Award by the National Alliance of Mental Illness Tennessee.

JULY —

- Chris Coelho, MMHC, who joined the team in 2015 to oversee quality improvement and analysis, was named Interim Executive Director.
- Courtney Robinson, MSW, joined our team as Community Relations Specialist.
- An Abe's Garden Community volunteer, resident, and team member were featured in a *Tennessean* article about the importance of volunteers returning to senior living communities after the pandemic.



SEPTEMBER

- Five team members and one resident received awards from LeadingAge Tennessee.
- We hosted an art show displaying the many projects of our memory support residents.

- APRIL

- The independent and assisted living resident newsletter was renamed *Community Buzz*.
- Volunteers returned to campus.

JUNE

- Independent and assisted living residents were welcomed to the renovated *Garden Café*, which features a new menu highlighting brain-healthy and heart-healthy items.
- The World Alzheimer Report 2020, in which Abe's Garden Community is featured and recognized as a dementia design groundbreaker, was awarded the European Healthcare Design 2021 Award for Outstanding Contribution to Global Knowledge.

AUGUST

- Weekly pet therapy resumed.
- A capital campaign feasibility study was completed.



OCTOBER



- Abe's Garden Community became a fully vaccinated campus, requiring everyone on campus to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Let's Grow Together capital campaign silent phase began.
- Nashville Opera's Opera on Wheels performed several tunes for residents and team members from our parking lot. The event was covered by *NewsChannel5 Nashville*.

DECEMBER

- After a campuswide donation drive designed to promote purposeful engagement, memory support residents organized donated items and dropped them off at the Nashville Rescue Mission, where they were given a tour.
- We hosted an anniversary pin ceremony to honor an employee celebrating 10 years with the organization and 7 employees celebrating 5 years.

NOVEMBER



 Independent and assisted living residents who have served our country displayed their memorabilia and shared stories in honor of Veterans Day.






2021 EXPENSE BREAKDOWN
